4PA students will gain control over many conventions of grammar throughout the school year as a means for making themselves understood as speakers and writers. Students will review and explore:


- 8 Parts of Speech

Conflict Leads to Change


- Determine the theme of a story, play, or poem, including how characters respond to challenges or conflict.
- Summarize implicit and explicit details of stories, dramas, poems, and nonfiction, including their themes or main ideas.
- Explain how an author uses facts, details, & evidence to support their ideas.



QUARTER 2

The Past Shapes Who We Are


- Integrate information from several print and digital sources to efficiently answer questions and solve problems.
- Identify and judge evidence that supports particular ideas in an author's argument to change a reader's point of view.
- Prepare for discussions, engaging fully and thoughtfully with others - contributing accurate, relevant information; elaborating on the remarks of others; synthesizing ideas.



QUARTER 3

Understanding Our World

- Compare and contrast the points of view from multiple accounts of the same event or topic.
- Determine how visual and multimedia support and enhance the meaning, tone, and beauty of a literary or informational text.




Students will learn about the Nervous System during quarters 3 & 4 in order to explore ways science helps individuals understand our world.
